Boating & Fishing

Our ocean and bay-side location make Atlantic City a prime catch for fisherman and boaters alike. The waters around Atlantic City are prime fishing grounds for flounder, bluefish, striped bass, tuna, swordfish, clams, crabs and many more. Private boat rentals and fishing excursions are available, in addition to fishing spots located throughout the city on piers, rock jetties and bridges.

If fishing is not quite your pace, the area offers many seasonal sightseeing cruises and is a perfect outlet for water sports. Guests can easily find themselves experiencing one of Atlantic City's best attractions by sailing, taking out a catamarans, surfing, kayaking, swimming, Jet Skiing, rowing, canoeing, and almost any other water-based activity you can imagine. Beach & Boardwalk

Atlantic City's pocket Aces. The beach and the Boardwalk are two Atlantic City attractions that have withstood the test of time and change. The site of the first organized lifeguard organization, Atlantic City beaches are free to the public and have been attracting visitors for more than 150 years. For everyone's safety, there are designated surf beaches at New Hampshire Avenue, Delaware Avenue and Raleigh Avenue.

The Boardwalk is a timeless favorite for taking a stroll, people watching and biking. Seasonal entertainment, including concerts, parades and special events are held on the Boardwalk free for you to enjoy. Biking on the Boardwalk is encouraged from 6 a.m. until 10 a.m., May through September, and 6 a.m. to Noon, October through April. Bike rentals are available. Another favorite Boardwalk activity are the rolling chairs. Sit back, relax and take a ride down the wooden way in any of Atlantic City's famed rolling chairs.

Atlantic City's official Visitors Center is located on the Boardwalk at Boardwalk Hall on Mississippi Avenue. An additional center is also located on the Atlantic City Expressway at milepost 3.5.

Regional

Part of what keeps Atlantic City so turned on, is the availability of activities and attractions located throughout the region. From historic villages to exciting water parks, the Atlantic City region is the perfect compliment to the excitement of the city.

Visit nearby Cape May to stroll through the collection of Victorian era style homes; the Wildwood and Ocean City boardwalks are home to exciting water parks, amusement rides, miniature golf and more; Margate is home to Lucy the Elephant, a six-story high elephant that you can walk through; Batsto Villiage is a restored 1766 town in the heart of the Pinelands; and minutes away in Egg Harbor Township, Story Book Land amusement park provides family fun for all ages.

Back in Atlantic City, the Absecon Lighthouse is the tallest lighthouse in New Jersey; Steel Pier located on the Boardwalk is a carnival like experience open seasonally with rides and games; and the Atlantic City Aquarium offers guests an opportunity to get up close with sharks, turtles, sea horses, jellyfish and more.

Shopping

Culture

Energetic promoters and fanciful attractions have been as synonymous with Atlantic City as the Boardwalk. From the days of the diving horses through to the present, Atlantic City's robust cultural impact is immortalized in the Atlantic City Historical Museum on Garden Pier at New Jersey Avenue. Explore the legends of the Jersey Devil, an old salts' haven and a grand glass industry in several themed villages' located minutes away from Atlantic City.

Located on the Boardwalk are two memorials commemorating the civil rights movement and New Jerseyans who lost their lives or were missing in action during the Korean War.

Boardwalk Hall is also the home base for the AC Ballet, which performs throughout the region and in neighboring states.

There are plenty of options for appreciating the fine arts with galleries showcasing local artists, 19th and 20th century fine art, folk art, crafts and more.

Antiques

Southern New Jersey is home to many one-of-a-kind antiques dealers, many of which are located along "Antique Alley," the affectionately nicknamed stretch of Route 9 from Cape May to Smithville.

Eco Outdoors
